### **GUEST SPEAKER**



Amy Nathan is a thought leader and executive in the burgeoning cannabis industry. After decades of working up the professional ladder, Amy left Corporate America in 2018 and is now the Founder and Co-CEO of LitSmart. LitSmart a company that provides health-and-safety resources to cannabis and psychedelics sectors, aiming to raise awareness and standards across all aspects of the broader entertainment

industry while also upgrading emergency management capabilities as these substances become more normalized in society.

Prior to LitSmart, Amy jumped into Cannabis by starting GROmentum Lab, a social-impact business accelerator that aimed to ease the burden of starting viable businesses for those most impacted by the failed war on drugs. Her work with GROmentum Lab received recognition from former Mayor of Chicago, Lori Lightfoot, and earned her a spot as a key contributor and economic development advisor on her Cannabis Working Group. Through this work, she has had the privilege to speak at numerous industry conferences like NECANN and Canacon and on syndicated radio programs such as WVON's The World as We See IT.

Before entering the Cannabis industry, Amy had spent over fifteen years honing her expertise in developing compliance-based solutions in highly regulated industries such as financial services, healthcare, and consumer and industrial products. She initially stumbled into this line of work accidentally, working as

a consultant for Price Waterhouse Coopers when she was asked to help privatize the then-largest steel-producing company that had been previously nationalized in South Korea. Later, she led initiatives to stabilize companies undergoing crises like Waste Management and Enron which helped prompt the establishment of Sarbanes-Oxley (SOX) compliance. These experiences allowed Amy to transition to healthcare with Caremark, later acquired by CVS, where she implemented Medicare Part D, or government-supported medication for seniors, and the Affordable Care Act, otherwise known as Obamacare. She punctuated her healthcare career by implementing the Obamacare Market Place Exchange for Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois, Texas, Montana, and New Mexico. From there, she led the reform of Anti-Money Laundering procedures at BMO Harris Bank after the Financial Crisis of the late aughts, the passing of Dodd-Frank, and the Patriot Acts post 9/11.

Amy has always welded dual passions for entrepreneurship and international business/economic development. She owned two businesses before graduating from UIUC where she studied Economics and Political Science and minored in Latin American Studies. Her last year of college set her up to travel internationally and work building bridges across cultures. Amy completed an independent study-work exchange program with a Latin American think tank known as CLASCO, or Instituto de Desarollo Economico y Social Argentina, where she completed her thesis which received the highest distinction. From there, after some months of travel in Latin America and Europe, she landed in Israel where she worked at the Center for Jewish-Arab Economic Development, forging

business ventures between Israelis and Palestinians of the region through their incubator program. She traveled between large cities, small villages, and the countryside to learn the challenges her partners faced during the hopeful years leading up to and just after the Oslo Accords of 1993.

Having always straddled the worlds of Social Science and Business Development, Amy went on to complete two master's degrees at the University of Chicago in Middle East Studies and an MBA with the goal of formalizing acquired competencies, studying regional economic interdependent agreements, particularly in the Middle East, and upskilling to a more corporate international business setting. Her work in consulting for PwC and IBM post-graduate school brought her on long-term assignments in South Korea, Argentina, Chile, Brazil, Finland, and Belgium.

Amy has volunteered in local Chicago politics. She is on the board of the Chicago Arts Partnership in Education and has been an active member of the Corporate Employee Resource Groups (ERGs) working with countless corporate and entrepreneurial mentees and in local synagogue communities. She has been an educator on workforce development topics at Ebenezer Baptist Church in Harvey, Illinois. The proud mom of a first grader at a Chicago Public School, Amy and her family are active in their synagogue community.

### **ACADEMIC DRESS**

Academic dress, consisting of cap, gown, and hood, originated about the twelfth century and was worn primarily for warmth. Subsequently, the material of the gown and lining, and the shape of the hood, represented the economic and social, as well as academic status of the wearer.

In the United States, the great majority of the academic costumes now worn are in accordance with the general provisions of the Intercollegiate Code of 1895, which was revised in 1932 and again in 1960. Under this code, the bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves, the master's gown has oblong sleeves with an arc at the bottom, and the doctor's gown has bell-shaped sleeves. All gowns are black, although the adoption of colored gowns by individual institutions in the United States is becoming more prevalent.

The bachelor's and master's gowns are untrimmed. The doctor's gown is faced down the front with velvet and has three bars of velvet across the sleeves. The facing and bars may be black or may be the color of the subject to which the degree pertains. The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's and doctor's gowns may be worn open or closed.

Hoods are also black. The bachelor's hood is 3 feet in length, the master's is 3 ½ feet, and the doctor's is 4 feet. Hoods are lined with the official color or colors of the college or university conferring the degree. At the University of Illinois, the lining is orange and blue. The colored velvet border of the hood, which is 2 inches, 3 inches, and 5 inches wide for the bachelor's, master's, and doctor's degree

respectively, identifies the faculty or field of study to which the degree pertains.

The black mortarboard cap is standard in the United States. Usually, all tassels are black, but where the graduating seniors do not wear hoods, as at the University of Illinois, the color of the cap tassel indicates the department of study. At the University of Illinois, candidates for degrees wear tassels on the right front quadrant of their caps before degrees are conferred, and move them to the left front quadrant after degrees are conferred. Caps are considered a part of the costume and are customarily removed only during an invocation or benediction, and then by men only.

For all academic purposes, including trimmings of doctor's gowns, edging of hoods, tassels of caps, and linings of banners, there are different colors associated with the different disciplines. The color for Liberal Arts & Sciences is white.

Caps and gowns were worn for the first time at the University of Illinois Commencement ceremony of 1897. In the early 1900s the Commencement procession marched up Burrill Avenue to the old Armory. After diplomas were received, the procession marched back to the lawn south of Green Street. The seniors sang the State song and "Auld Lang Syne" before they said good-bye to each other and the campus.
